A Mayan designed and pirate-themed resort destination, Calico Jack's Village features seven spacious beachfront cabanas and two villas nestled amongst coconut palms and tropical vegetation on a beautiful secluded beach, 12 miles north of Placencia village. Amenities include a full-service bar and open-air restaurant, swimming pool, complimentary bicycles and kayaks, volleyball, and a large dock over the ocean for lazy afternoons in a hammock with a book or a pina colada. The village offers wedding packages and a variety of land and sea tours.
